# What makes me eligible?









You're a full or part-time U.S. associate working for Walmart Inc. or its affiliates. Temporary or terminated associates are not eligible.

You've worked with Walmart for at least 90 days. You meet the financial need and event requirements. See below and on One.Walmart.com.

The reason you need financial help has to have happened within the last year, during the time you've worked at Walmart.

## What are the financial need and event requirements?

#### **Financial Need**

- You'll need to be prepared to report your monthly household income and expenses.
- You'll also need to report how much money you have in savings.

### **Event Categories**

- Major illness, injury or death
- Unexpected household situation
- Involuntary loss of, or damage to, housing or transportation
- Unexpected unemployment

# What expenses can a Together Fund grant help with?

The Together Fund may provide assistance with the following types of expenses, with proper documentation.



Housing and utilities



Transportation assistance



Other basic needs

## How much assistance would I qualify for?

Eligible associates may qualify for a maximum of \$1,500 within a rolling, five-year period. For example, if you receive \$1,000 in support the first time you apply, you could be eligible to receive an additional \$500 within five years.
